WHEREAS, Marion County obtained information indicating that certain drug companies and their corporate affiliates, parents, subsidiaries, and such other defendants as may be added to the litigation (collectively, "Defendants") have engaged in fraudulent and/or reckless marketing and/or distribution of opioids that have resulted in addictions and overdoses; and

WHEREAS, these actions, conduct and misconduct have resulted in significant financial costs in the past to the County and will undoubtedly result in significant financial costs in the future; and

WHEREAS, the County brought or has investigated claims against (1) Walgreens Co., ("Walgreens Defendants"), CVS Health Corporation and CVS Pharmacy, Inc ("CVS Defendants"), and Walmart, Inc. ("Walmart Defendants), and certain other defendants related to potentially released claims; and (2) other defendants in the opioid supply chain on behalf of the County in *In Re: Texas Opioid Litigation*, MDL No. 2018-63587, currently pending in the 152nd District Court of Harris County, Texas and/or removed pending remand; and

WHEREAS, on May 16, 2023, the Walgreens Defendants, June 6, 2023 the CVS Defendants, and June 22, 2023 the Walmart Defendants in the opioid litigation brought by the County, the State of Texas, through the Office of the Attorney General, and a negotiation group for Texas political subdivisions entered into an Agreement entitled Walgreens Texas Settlement Agreement and Release, CVS Texas Settlement Agreement and Release, and Walmart Texas Settlement Agreement and Release (hereinafter collectively the "Texas Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, Special Counsel and the State of Texas have recommended that the Marion County Commissioners Court support the adoption and approval of the Texas Agreement in its entirety; and

WHEREAS, even though the payments from the settlements reflect partial compensation to Marion County for the past damages it has suffered or the future damages it is likely to incur, given the risks of litigation, the fact that it is to the benefit of Texas and the County and its residents, and that it reduces the risks associated with protracted litigation:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that we, the Commissioners Court of Marion County:

- 1. Support the adoption and approval the Texas Agreement;
- 2. Authorizes the County to execute the Texas Release for the Texas Subdivision Participation Form and Release; and
- 3. Finds as follows:
 - There is a substantial need for repayment of past opioid-related expenditures and payment to help abate current and future opioid-related harms in and about Marion County, Texas; and
 - b. The County Commissioners Court supports in its entirety the Texas Agreement. The County Commissioners Court understands that the purpose of each Settlement is to effectuate resolution of the Opioid Litigation against the Walgreens Defendants, CVS Defendants and Walmart Defendants. We also understand that an additional purpose is to ensure the effective means of distributing any potential settlement funds obtained under settlements in Texas and under the jurisdiction of Texas Courts in a manner and means that would promote an effective and meaningful use of the funds in abating the opioid epidemic in this County and throughout Texas.

The County is hereby authorized to approve and accept the Texas Agreement as set forth herein.

The County Judge or designated official is hereby authorized to execute and deliver the settlement documents recommended for approval by Special Counsel in the above referenced case and to approve such terms and provisions for the full and final settlement of all matters set forth therein.

The releases provided for in the Walmart Texas Settlement are intended by the Parties to be broad and shall be interpreted so as to give the Released Entity the broadest possible bar against any liability relating in any way to Released Claims and extend to the full extent of the power of the Texas Political Subdivision to release claims. The Walmart Texas Settlement shall be a complete bar to any Released Claim.
- 9. The Texas Political Subdivision hereby takes on all rights and obligations of a Participating Texas Subdivision as set forth in the Walmart Texas Settlement.
- 10. In connection with the releases provided for in the Walmart Texas Settlement, each Texas Political Subdivision expressly waives, releases, and forever discharges any and all provisions, rights, and benefits conferred by any law of any state or territory of the United States or other jurisdiction, or principle of common law, which is similar, comparable, or equivalent to § 1542 of the California Civil Code, which reads:

General Release; extent. A general release does not extend to claims that the creditor or releasing party does not know or suspect to exist in his or her favor at the time of executing the release that, if known by him or her, would have materially affected his or her settlement with the debtor or released party.

A Releasor may hereafter discover facts other than or different from those which it knows, believes, or assumes to be true with respect to the Released Claims, but each Texas Political Subdivision hereby expressly waives and fully, finally, and forever settles, releases and discharges, upon the Effective Date, any and all Released Claims that may exist as of such date but which Releasors do not know or suspect to exist, whether through ignorance, oversight, error, negligence or through no fault whatsoever, and which, if known, would materially affect the Governmental Entities' decision to participate in the Walmart Texas Settlement.

Penalties and Rewards are administered at the county or district level.

INTERLOCAL CONTRACT FOR COUNTY 9-1-1 DATABASE MAINTENANCE

Article 1: Parties and Purpose

- 1.1. The East Texas Council of Governments (ETCOG) is a regional planning commission and political subdivision of the State of Texas organized and operating under the Texas Regional Planning Act of 1965, as amended, chapter 391 of the Local Government Code. ETCOG has developed a *Strategic Plan* to establish and maintain 9-1-1 emergency telephone services in State Planning Region 06, and the Texas Commission on State Emergency Communications (CSEC) has approved its current *Plan*.
- 1.2. The County of **MARION** is a Texas Local Government that has completed the physical addressing process as defined by County Addressing Standards.
- 1.3. This contract is entered into between ETCOG and MARION COUNTY ("The County") under chapter 791 of the Government Code so that ETCOG can maintain the physical addresses assigned in the county and assign new growth addresses in the County.

Article 2: Goods and Services

- 2.1 ETCOG agrees to:
- (1) Perform tasks listed in Attachment A, Scope of Work; and
- (2) Protect the confidentiality of addressing databases furnished by telecommunications providers.

Article 3: Contract Price and Payment Terms

3.1. After the effective date of this contract ETCOG agrees to conduct all assigned services for the amount listed in *Attachment B*, *Cost of Services*. The cost of services are to be prepaid and are due immediately and in advance of services to be rendered.

Article 4: Effective Date and Term of Contract

4.1. This agreement shall be in effect <u>September 1, 2023 to August 31, 2025</u>, unless sooner terminated under Article 10.

Article 5: Performance Reports

5.1 No performance reports are required under this contract.

Article 6: Compliance with Applicable Law and Policy

6.1. ETCOG agrees to comply with all applicable law and policy in carrying out this contract. Applicable law and policy includes but are not limited to the State Administration of Emergency Communications Act, chapter 771, Texas Health and Safety Code; rules implementing the Act contained in title I, part XII, Texas Administrative Code; the *Uniform Grant Management Standards* (Governor's Office of Budget and Planning, Jan. 1998); Texas Advisory Commission on State Emergency Communications, 9-1-1 PROGRAMS Policies and Procedures.

Article 7: Independent Contractor, Assignment and Subcontracting

- 7.1. ETCOG is not an employee or agent of the county but furnishes goods and services under this contract solely as an independent contractor.
- 7.2. ETCOG may not assign its rights or subcontract its duties under this contract without the prior written consent of the county. An attempted assignment or subcontract in violation of this paragraph is void.
- 7.3. If <u>MARION COUNTY</u> consents to subcontracting, each subcontract is subject to all of the terms and conditions of this contract, and ETCOG agrees to furnish a copy of this contract to each of its subcontractors.

Article 8: Records and Monitoring

- 8.1. ETCOG agrees to maintain financial, statistical, costs, and receipts under this contract. ETCOG agrees to maintain these records at their offices.
- 8.2. Subject to the additional requirement of paragraph 8.3, ETCOG agrees to preserve the records for three years after receiving its final payment under this contract.
- 8.3. If an audit of or information in the records is disputed or the subject of litigation, ETCOG agrees to preserve the records until the dispute or litigation is finally concluded, regardless of the expiration or early termination of this contract.
- 8.4. MARION COUNTY is entitled to inspect and copy, during normal business hours at ETCOG's office, the records maintained under this contract for as long as they are preserved. The county is also entitled to visit ETCOG's offices, talk to its personnel, and audit its records, all during normal business hours, to assist in evaluating its performance under this contract.
- 8.5. MARION COUNTY agrees to notify ETCOG at least 24 hours in advance of any intended visit for the purposes described in paragraph 8.4. Upon receipt of the counties notice, ETCOG agrees to notify the appropriate department(s) specified in the notice.
- 8.6. The CSEC and the Texas State Auditor have the same inspection, copying, and visitation rights as the county.

Article 9: Nondiscrimination and Equal Opportunity

9.1. ETCOG shall not exclude anyone from participating under this contract, deny anyone benefits under this contract, or otherwise unlawfully discriminate against anyone in carrying out this contract because of race, color, religion, sex, age, disability, handicap, or national origin.

Article 10: Suspension and Early Termination of Contract

- 10.1. If the county or ETCOG breaches a material provision of this contract, the other may notify the breaching party describing the breach and demanding corrective action. The breaching party has five business days from its receipt of the notice to correct the breach, or to begin and continue with reasonable diligence and in good faith to correct the breach. If the breach cannot be corrected within a reasonable time, despite the breaching party's reasonable diligence and good faith effort to do so, the parties may agree to terminate the contract or either party may invoke the dispute resolution process of Article 12.
- 10.2. Termination for breach under paragraph 10.1 does not waive either party's claim for damages resulting from the breach, and both <u>MARION COUNTY</u> and ETCOG among other remedies may withhold from compensation owed the other an amount necessary to satisfy its claim against the other.
- 10.3. The ending of this contract under Article 4 or its early termination under this Article 10 does not affect ETCOG's duty:
 - (1) To repay <u>MARION COUNTY</u> for expenditures made in violation of applicable law or policy in accordance with Article 6; and
 - (2) To preserve its records and permit inspection, copying, and auditing of its records and visitation of its premises and personnel under Article 8.

Article 11: County Responsibilities

11.1 The county agrees to notify ETCOG of any changes in their Emergency Service Zones (EMS, Fire, & Law Enforcement), and/or The County boundary. The notification of the changes shall be made in writing with the supporting documentation to ETCOG at least 30 days prior to the change.

Article 12: Dispute Resolution

12.1. The parties desire to resolve disputes arising under this contract without litigation. Accordingly, if a dispute arises, the parties agree to attempt in good faith to resolve the dispute between them. To this end, the parties agree not to sue one another, except to enforce compliance with Article 12, until they have exhausted the procedures set out in this Article.

- 12.2. At the written request of either party, each party shall appoint one non-lawyer representative to negotiate informally and in good faith to resolve any dispute arising under this contract. The representatives appointed shall determine the location, format, frequency, and duration of the negotiations.
- 12.3. If the representatives cannot resolve the dispute within 30 calendar days after the first negotiation meeting, the parties agree to refer the dispute to the Dispute Resolution Center of Austin for mediation in accordance with the Center's mediation procedures by a single mediator assigned by the Center. Each party shall pay half the cost of the Center's mediation services.
- 12.4. The parties agree to continue performing their duties under this contract, which are unaffected by the dispute, during the negotiation and mediation process.

Article 13: Notices to Parties

- 13.1 Notice to be effective under this contract must be in writing and received by the party against whom it is to operate. Notice is received by a party: (l) when it is delivered to the party personally; (2) on the date shown on the return receipt if mailed by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, to the party's address specified in paragraph 13.2 and signed on behalf of the party; or (3) three business days after its deposit in the United States mail, with first-class postage affixed, addressed to the party's address specified in paragraph

Article 14: Miscellaneous

- 14.1. Each individual signing this contract on behalf of a party warrants that he or she is legally authorized to do so and that the party is legally authorized to perform the obligations undertaken.
- 14.2. This contract states the entire agreement of the parties, and an amendment to it is not effective unless in writing and signed by all parties.

Participation Agreement

- 1. Services; Agency Appointment and Effect. The above-named entity ("Participant") and AllPaid agree that AllPaid is to act as Participant's agent for the limited purpose of receiving payments from Payers on Participant's behalf and Participant expressly authorizes AllPaid to act as its agent for the receipt of Payer funds. Payment from the Payer to AllPaid by use of AllPaid's payment processing services shall be considered payment to Participant, extinguishing the Payer's payment obligation to Participant (in the amount paid by the Payer) as if the Payer had paid Participant directly, subject to any right Participant has to reject such transaction. AllPaid, and not the individual Payer, is solely liable to Participant for Payer funds if AllPaid fails to remit funds to Participant from Payers using AllPaid's services and AllPaid accepts such appointment subject to any conditions and limitations in this Participation Agreement and any attachments hereto ("Agreement"). AllPaid shall provide Participant with training, documentation, and electronic and telephonic support at AllPaid's expense. AllPaid shall cause funds to be forwarded electronically to such account as Participant designates within two banking days after transaction authorization. AllPaid shall provide Participant with participation procedures that Participant must follow in using AllPaid's payment services.
- **2. Term and Termination.** This Agreement shall become effective upon the date of the latter signature to this Agreement ("Effective Date") and shall continue for three years, automatically renewing for additional one-year periods commencing on the third anniversary of the Effective Date. This Agreement may be terminated (i) by Participant at any time with or without cause upon 30 days' written notice to AllPaid; (ii) by AllPaid upon 30 days' written notice to Participant prior to any renewal term; or (iii) by either party immediately upon notice to the other party of such other party's material breach of this Agreement, subject to a reasonable opportunity to cure such breach.
- **3. Fees.** AllPaid shall collect the Service Fees shown in Attachment "A" based on type of payment processed from the Payer or from Participant, as Participant specifies to AllPaid, on behalf of Participant, retaining such Service Fees as its sole compensation. Participant may select any or all of the payment types available as follows:
- For cash bail/bond payments, "Service Fee Schedule for Bail Payments" applies.
- For criminal justice-related payments, such as fees for probation management, electronic monitoring, work release, restitution, or other payments associated with reducing or avoiding a term of incarceration, "Service Fee Schedule for Criminal Justice-Related Payments" applies.
- For payment of civil fines or fees, "Service Fee Schedule for Civil Fines and Payments" applies.

AllPaid will apply its then-current Service Fee to the payment types Participant has selected for processing under this Agreement. AllPaid may modify any or all Service Fees at its sole option, providing Participant with 30 days' advance written notice. **ALL SERVICE FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.** AllPaid reserves the right to charge Participant for services or equipment beyond the scope of this Agreement, such as custom software development, non-AllPaid standard peripheral devices, and other services and support as the parties may agree.

4. Disputes and Chargebacks. AllPaid shall be responsible for handling all transaction disputes associated with Payers' use of cards to make payments to Participant through AllPaid. Further, AllPaid shall be responsible for all chargebacks initiated not more than 180 days after the transaction. If AllPaid determines that a chargeback may be inappropriate, AllPaid expects Participant to provide reasonable assistance in any challenge AllPaid makes to

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the chargeback. AllPaid reserves the right to adjust service and security levels as AllPaid reasonably deems necessary to maintain payment security and integrity.

- **5. Warranties.** Each party warrants that this Agreement is valid, binding, and enforceable against such party in accordance with its terms and that each party has full power and authority to execute and deliver this Agreement and to perform its obligations hereunder. AllPaid further warrants that during the performance of this Agreement, AllPaid (i) shall provide services in a non-discriminatory manner and shall not deny services or employment on the basis of race, creed, color, national origin, sex, age, disability, sexual orientation, military status, marital status, or any other legally protected class; (ii) will comply with all applicable laws and regulations and the rules and procedures applicable to the credit and debit card brands it accepts and processes; and (iii) in accordance with then-current PCI DSS requirements, will maintain proper security and responsibility for Payer data while it is in AllPaid's possession, all at AllPaid's sole cost. Participant further warrants that Participant's decisions and instructions to AllPaid with respect to Payer responsibility for payment of all or any part of the Service Fee shall conform with applicable law.
- 6. Indemnification and Disclaimers. AllPaid shall indemnify and save harmless Participant, its agents, officers, and employees from responsibility or liability for all damages, costs, expenses, (including reasonable attorney fees and defense costs) relating to death or bodily injury or damages to physical property directly resulting from AllPaid's performance under this Agreement. ALLPAID ACCEPTS NO RESPONSIBILITY FOR SECURITY OF PAYER DATA ON SYSTEMS OTHER THAN THOSE CONTROLLED BY ALLPAID. ALLPAID LIABILITY WITH RESPECT TO PAYMENTS PROCESSED HEREUNDER IS LIMITED TO MAKING PAYMENTS IN THE AMOUNTS AUTHORIZED. ALLPAID IS NOT A SURETY AND PROCESSING A PAYMENT THROUGH ALLPAID DOES NOT GUARANTEE ANY PARTICULAR OUTCOME INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, A DEFENDANT'S COURT APPEARANCE OR FULL SATISFACTION OF A FINANCIAL OBLIGATION. OTHER THAN WARRANTIES EXPLICITLY MADE IN THIS AGREEMENT, ALLPAID DISCLAIMS ALL WARRANTIES OR REPRESENTATIONS OF ANY KIND, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED. NEITHER PARTY SHALL BE LIABLE FOR INCIDENTAL, INDIRECT, PUNITIVE, OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES EVEN IF ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES. PARTICIPANT BEARS RESPONSIBILITY FOR ANY ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIONS IT MAY TAKE IN CONNECTION WITH SERVICES PROVIDED UNDER THIS AGREEMENT.
- **7. Independent Contractor.** AllPaid shall provide all services to Participant as an independent contractor. Other than the limited agency of AllPaid to accept payments for Participant, nothing contained herein shall be deemed to create any association, partnership, joint venture, or relationship of master and servant or employer and employee between the parties or to provide either party with the right, power, or authority, expressed or implied, to create any such duty or obligation on behalf of the other party.
- 8. Taxes. AllPaid shall be responsible for the payment of all taxes legally imposed upon its services.
- **9. - **10. AllPaid grants Participant a license to use such card readers and Firmware for the duration of the Agreement. Participant's use of card readers and Firmware shall be limited to the purposes of this Agreement. Acceptance and use of card readers does not convey to Participant any title, patent, copyright, or other proprietary right in or to the Firmware. At all times, AllPaid or its suppliers retain all rights to the Firmware, including but not limited to updates, enhancements, and additions. Participant shall not attempt to access or disclose the Firmware to any party, or transfer, copy, license, sub-license, modify, translate, reverse engineer, decompile, disassemble, tamper with, or create any derivative work based on Firmware. Participant will use reasonable care to protect card readers from loss, theft, damage or any legal encumbrance. AllPaid shall provide card readers and installation instructions at service implementation and when providing any replacement or additional card readers by shipment to a location Participant designates or, at AllPaid's option, Participant will allow AllPaid and its designated representatives reasonable access to Participant's premises for training purposes and device installation, repair, removal, modification, upgrades, and relocation.

Card readers for use with *Gov\$wipe* are designed to communicate Payer data to AllPaid through Participant's computing equipment to which they are cable-attached via USB port. Internet access to AllPaid is required for transaction processing via *Gov\$wipe* and is enabled solely by Participant's computers and networks. Participant is responsible to use standard safeguards and practices to keep its computers and networks secure and free from malicious software or hardware. AllPaid shall not be held liable to Participant for exposure of Participant's computers or networks to malicious software or hardware of any kind. AllPaid is solely responsible for the maintenance of any card readers and shall supply Participant with replacement card readers on Participant's request and as AllPaid deems appropriate. Upon termination of the Agreement, AllPaid may require Participant to return card readers at AllPaid's expense and by such method as AllPaid specifies.

- **12. Miscellaneous.** There are no third-party beneficiaries to this Agreement. This Agreement may not be assigned, in whole or in part, by either party hereto without prior written consent of the other party, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld. Either party is excused from performance and shall not be liable for any delay in performance or non-performance, in whole or in part, caused by the occurrence of any contingency beyond the control of the non-performing party including, but not limited to, work stoppages, fires, civil disobedience, riots, rebellions, terrorism, loss of power or telecommunications, flood, storm, Acts of God, and similar occurrences. This Agreement shall be governed by the internal laws of the state in which Participant is located. Litigation regarding this Agreement shall be filed in state or federal courts of appropriate jurisdiction in or near the county in which Participant is located. Any waiver must in in writing and signed by the party to be charged and a waiver of any portion of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver or renunciation of other portions. Rights and obligations under this Agreement which by their nature should survive will remain in effect after termination or expiration hereof. In the event that any provision of this Agreement is adjudicated by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal, void, or unenforceable, all other provisions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
- **13. Completeness.** This Agreement including its authorized attachment(s) is the entire agreement between the parties and expresses the complete understanding of the parties, superseding all prior or contemporaneous agreements with regard to the subject matter herein. This Agreement may not be altered, amended or modified

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except in a writing incorporated hereto and signed by the parties, provided, however, that AllPaid may revise the terms of this Agreement if required to comply with law, regulation, or card industry rules and AllPaid provides prompt notice to Participant of such change(s) and may modify fees per Section 3.

14. Execution. This Agreement may be executed simultaneously in multiple counterparts, each of which is deemed an original, but all of which taken together constitute one and the same instrument. All signed fax or electronically imaged counterparts to this Agreement shall be deemed as valid as originals.

This Supplemental Agreement No. 1 is made and entered into between the Secretary of the Army, party of the first part, hereinafter referred to as the Government, and Marion County, a political subdivision of the state, duly organized and existing under an by virtue of the laws of the State of Texas, 102 West Austin Street, Jefferson, Texas, 75657, party of the second part, hereinafter referred to as the Lessee;

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, on August 19, 2013, the Government granted to Marion County, the above numbered lease for the operation and maintenance of the Mims Volunteer Fire Department, for a period of five (5) years beginning August 1, 2013 and ending July 31, 2018, with four (4), five (5) year options at Lake O' the Pines, Marion County, Texas, as more specifically described in said lease.

WHEREAS, Lessee has requested to exercise their first five year option period, changing the term of the lease to expire on July 31, 2023, and

WHEREAS, the clauses regarding Executive Order 13658 and Executive Order 13706 shall be incorporated into said lease.

NOW THEREFORE, Lease DACW63-1-13-0842 is hereby amended in the following respects only:

- 1. Delete the language of Condition 1. **TERM**, in its entirety and substitute in lieu thereof, "Said Premises are hereby leased for a term of five (5) years, beginning 1 August 2018 and ending 31 July 2023 with three (3) five (5) year options, but revocable at will by the Secretary."
- 2. Add as Condition **33. DETERMINATION REGARDING EXECUTIVE ORDER 13658**, the following words, "a. It has been determined this contract is not subject to Executive Order 13658 or the regulations issued by the Secretary of Labor in 29 CFR Part 10 pursuant to the Executive Order.

- b. If a duly authorized representative of the United States discovers or determines, whether before or subsequent to executing this contract, that an erroneous determination regarding the applicability of Executive Order 13658 was made, contractor, to the extent permitted by law, agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the United States, its officers, agents, and employees, for and from any and all liabilities, losses, claims, expenses, suites, fines, penalties, judgments, demands or actions, costs, fees, and damages directly or indirectly arising out of, caused by, related to, resulting from or in any way predicated upon, in whole or in part, the erroneous Executive Order 13658 determination. This includes contractor releasing any claim or entitlement it would otherwise have to an equitable adjustment to the contract and indemnifying and holding harmless the United States from the claims of subcontractors and contractor employees.
- 3. Add as Condition **34. DETERMINATION REGARDING EXECUTIVE ORDER 13706**, the following words, "It has been determined this contract is not subject to Executive Order 13706 or the regulations issued by the Secretary of Labor in 29 CFR part 13 pursuant to the Executive Order."

EXCEPT for the revisions above, the terms and conditions of the lease shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.
