Community Healthcore to Open New Primary Care Clinic in Jefferson – A Collaborative Effort to Improve Local Healthcare Access

Jefferson, TX — July 1, 2026 — Community Healthcore, in partnership with the Marion County Health & Resource Coalition, Jefferson ISD, University of Texas at Tyler – School of Medicine, and the Marion County Hospital District, is proud to announce the upcoming opening of a new primary care clinic, CORE Health Systems, in Jefferson. This long-awaited healthcare initiative will serve residents of Marion County providing accessible, affordable, and comprehensive healthcare for children, adolescents, and adults.

The new clinic, located in the Marion County Hospital District building, 1113 North Walcott, Suite B, will create opportunities for Marion County residents to receive quality care close to home. By bringing together resources and expertise from multiple organizations, this clinic will offer a full spectrum of preventative services, chronic disease management, and treatment for illnesses and injuries. It will also address mental health needs, ensuring a holistic approach to patient well-being.

Starting in late July 2026, the clinic will open one day a week from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Thursdays. It will serve both walk-in patients and those with scheduled appointments. Families can access comprehensive care for all ages, from birth through adulthood, making it a convenient, all-in-one resource for the entire community.

"We are proud to bring accessible healthcare directly to the residents of Marion County, fostering healthier families and a stronger community. This initiative is a long time coming and is the first step in a long process to determine our ability to build services in the community," said Steve Archer, Director of Health Services at Community Healthcore.

Will Thomas, President of the Marion County Health & Resource Coalition, added, "This clinic is the result of dedicated collaboration among local organizations committed to improving health outcomes in Marion County. This partnership exemplifies what can be achieved when organizations unite with a shared vision."
